

## Spanish Fort Gets PO Rural Station Postmaster Says

Effective November 1, Spanish Fort will receive its designation as a post office, with the establishment of a contract rural station, a tributary of the Daphne post office, Lloyd C. McMillan, postmaster at Daphne announces.

To be located at the intersection of highways 31, 90 and 98, the new post office will be quartered in space provided by George and David Fuller, located just south of the restaurant on Highway 90.

McMillan said Harmon C. Hanson of Spanish Fort, will be the clerk in charge.

Services to be required by the postmaster include the sale of stamp supplies, the transaction of money order business and the acceptance and dispatch of ordinary, registered, insured, certified and C.O.D.

mail.

The station will be supplied by star route, Mobile to Point Clear, trips 1 and 4, daily except Sundays and holidays, and by rural route from Daphne.

"Spanish Fort, Alabama" will be the mailing address for direct delivery at this station to the patrons desiring earlier receipt of their mail in lieu of later receipt over the present rural route, and afternoon receipt as well, McMillan said.

Lock-boxes will be available for rental at a nominal rate on the quarterly basis, and patrons may change address on POD Form 3578, which will be available at the post office.

McMillan explained that no change is anticipated in the operation of the present rural route, and the patrons desiring to continue receipt and dispatch of mails through rural boxes on this route should make no change in their address; namely, Route 1, Daphne, Alabama.

Those using box service may receipt their mail during closing hours of the station, as the lobby of the station will remain open 7:00 a.m. to 9 p.m., to permit receipt of mail through this box service.

The hours of window service will be 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., daily except Sundays and holidays, but will be closed at noon on Saturdays, McMillan said.
